The sales were sealed at the Spring Caravan and Camping Show at the National Exhibition Centre, in the West Midlands.

Lunar chairman and CEO, Brian Mellor, said: "This was a great show for us as it saw Lunar's exciting launch back into the motorhome market. The brand new Lunar Vacanza Camper Car was unveiled for the first time on opening morning to expectant press and public, with the first few sales secured on opening day.

"As well as achieving great product sales, we also have a considerable number of enquiries and test drive requests making us optimistic of further sales in the coming months."

Lunar Caravans was established in 1969 and employs 250 people at its headquarters at Sherdley Road.



Leyland Trucks to Build New DAF Low Emission Models

Two new truck models launched by DAF are to be built by Leyland Trucks at its modern plant in Farington.

The DAF LF and CF models, which meet new European-wide Euro 6 emissions standards coming into effect at the end of the year, will be built alongside the new Euro 6 XF for long haulage; production of the Right Hand Driver version has already started at Leyland Trucks.

The CF will enter production in the summer, followed by the new LF series in the autumn.

The Euro 6 LF and CF models were launched at the Commercial Vehicle Show in Birmingham earlier this year. They have been developed by engineering teams at DAF Trucks in the Netherlands and at Leyland Trucks. The development programme was the largest ever undertaken by the two companies, both of which are subsidiaries of US truck manufacturer, PACCAR Inc.

Emissions from the new models will be more than 95 per cent cleaner than those under the first stages of the Euro emissions legislation introduced some 20 years ago.

Leyland Trucks operates the UK's only volume truck assembly plant. Significant investments were made in the facilities in order to design and produce industry-leading trucks meeting the new Euro 6 emission standards next to the current Euro 5 model series.

"These new trucks set the industry standard for efficiency and driver comfort," says Ron Augustyn, managing director of Leyland Trucks. "Meeting the new emission legislation in the best way is vital to our continuing success in expanding DAF's presence across Europe where it is the fastest growing truck marque. The LF truck will be manufactured exclusively in Leyland."

Leyland Trucks employs 1,000 people at its state-of-the-art plant at Croston Road, Leyland.

DAF Trucks is the market leader in the UK truck market accounting for almost one in three new trucks sold. All of these are produced at Leyland along with trucks for sale throughout mainland Europe and beyond.

New Facility Delivers Business Growth



Chemical Reaction in Matrix Park

North West Projects, a Chorley firm that provides mechanical design services for the nuclear and chemical industries, will relocate to Matrix Park, Buckshaw Village this summer.

The company is currently constructing a new 30,000 sq ft building that will house 150 of the company's specialist technical designers. The move will create 60 new jobs in the area over the next three years.

North West Projects worked closely with South Ribble Borough Council to identify a suitable site for the building and navigate the planning process.

Providing the ideal base to help the business grow, the new facility will include state-of-the-art IT and security systems to enable the company to work on high security work for military sites. It will also feature a café, conference facilities, a gym and meeting spaces.

Frank Dalton, managing director at North West Projects, said: "We are all very excited about moving into the new facility and are delighted at the support we have received from the council and our bank who have shown great confidence in our plans."

Internationally-renowned sculptor Charles Hadcock has been commissioned to install a sculpture for the site, which will be his first piece displayed in the North West and has been manufactured in South Ribble.

North West Projects has set aside 10,000 sq ft to lease to other companies and is hoping to attract businesses with a nuclear or technical focus. The company has also secured planning permission for a further 20,000 sq ft on the site.

North West Projects has grown in the past six years from 20 to 160 staff and now has a turnover of £12m.

New Facility on the Rise

The Dr. Oetker Group has announced that the re-development of its Leyland manufacturing site is progressing well. Due to be fully operational during 2013, investment for the new production facility is part of a three-year programme that will secure the future of the site as a centre of excellence for the Dr. Oetker Group and cement its long-term viability.

A statement from the firm said: "Ultimately, the increased production capacity will safeguard hundreds of jobs and also create new ones."

South Ribble Borough Council, working together with Jobcentre Plus and Preston College, is supporting the new development and the recruitment and training of staff.

£12m to Open Up **Enterprise Zone**

Lancashire Enterprise Partnership has submitted a bid for £12.4m of government funding to open up access to BAE Systems' site at Samlesbury.

The funding would pay for a new entrance to the site off the A59 Whalley Road as well as further new roads to support the development of buildings on the site.

If the bid is successful, work on the new buildings is expected to begin in 2014.

The Lancashire Enterprise Zone spans 150 hectares of land at BAE Systems' globally-renowned Samlesbury and Warton sites. Companies that relocate to the zone will benefit from flexible support from the public and private sectors, simplified planning regulations and government-backed tax relief on business rates.

The zone is expected to create 6,000 new jobs by 2015, with a further 6,000 in the manufacturing supply chain.

Meanwhile, the deputy chairman of Walton Summit-based Eric Wright Group has been appointed to the board of the Lancashire Enterprise Partnership, the driving force behind the Enterprise Zone.

Jim Carter, deputy chairman of the Group (pictured below), replaces Mike Appleton, chairman of the Fylde Coast Economic Development Company.

South Ribble Attracts New Investment

Full Speed Ahead at Torotrak

Torotrak, the Leyland-based company that develops technology to improve transport efficiency, has agreed a £6m licensing deal and acquired a 20 per cent stake in a Midlands-based business.

Indianapolis-based Allison Transmission paid £2m in March, with a further £1.4m payable in July 2013 and £2.6m in March 2014 for perpetual exclusive rights to use Torotrak's main drive transmission technology in the commercial vehicles market. The company also bought additional shares in Torotrak, raising £2.5m.

Torotrak has also invested £3m to acquire a 20 per cent stake in Nottinghamshire-based Flybrid Automotive, which makes hybrid energy storage devices based on high-speed flywheel technology for Formula 1 and mainstream vehicles.

The deal includes an exclusive option to acquire the remaining 80 per cent of the company by December 2013.

Torotrak CEO Jeremy Deering said: "The announcement of the Allison agreement, and our investment in Flybrid, represent collectively an important milestone and I believe a true turning point for the company."



Hawks Contract for Samlesbury

Production is underway on a new fleet of specialist training aircraft at BAE Systems' factory in Samlesbury.

BAE Systems was commissioned to produce 30 Hawk Advanced Jet Trainers following orders from Saudi Arabia and Oman.

The wings of the aircraft are being built at Samlesbury, with the final assembly and testing taking place in Warton. The first finished aircraft will fly from Warton in 2015.

The plans mean Lancashire is now home to three major BAE Systems production lines: the company's Eurofighter Typhoon is assembled in Warton, with production of the F-35 stealth fighter taking place in Samlesbury.

A new production line with an overhead monorail system was added to the F-35 facility in October, taking the company's total spend on machinery connected to the aircraft to £150m.

BAE Systems has also announced that it will recruit 387 engineering and business apprentices across its UK business in 2013 - 60 more than the previous year.

The new recruits will join the company's five-year Higher Apprenticeship Programme, which combines on-the-job training with the opportunity to study for degree-level qualifications.

Chris Allam, senior vice-president for the F-35 project at BAE Systems, said the development would add another state-of-the-art element to the F-35 facility.

He said: "Less than six months since completing the extension to this world-class facility, we have now got a world-class assembly line to go with it. As far as manufacturing goes, this puts us right at the top of the premier league."

Law Firm Upgrades to New Offices

Marsden Rawsthorn Solicitors has relocated its Chorley team to more modern, larger offices at Matrix Park, Buckshaw Village.

Debbie Pettitt, chief executive said: "These new premises provide much more flexibility for our growth. The new premises also offer a modern reception area and plenty of free parking for visitors.

Festival-goers paid £5 each for a wristband to allow them entry to all events. Participating venues included the Fleece Inn, Slice of Sicily, the Cow Shed, Penwortham Library and the Aphrodite Health Food Store.

Nigel Stewart, co-ordinator of the Creatives Network, said: "It was staggering. Normally, on a Friday or Saturday night, Penwortham is dead. Suddenly this sleepy urban area was full of people and all the ATMs were empty by the end of the weekend."

"It was a great boost for local businesses and the people who came loved it. On the Friday night you couldn't physically get in the local pub and they very nearly ran out of beer. It was a tremendous atmosphere."

This year's Leyland Live will take place on 5 and 6 July.
